

What is Online Learning?



- Online learning is a program where students will receive all of their educational instruction online from specialized teachers, offering an ability to access quality learning activities and content in a flexible timetable and format.
- Research indicates that online learning increases motivation for students allowing them to work at a pace that matches their learning needs.
- RDCRS recognizes that students who are elite athletes, performers, students who suffer from chronic illness, students and families who choose this as an effective way to meet their learning needs may look to select online learning.



Synchronous & Asynchronous Learning



- RDCRS believes that like any skill, online learning requires increased support and guidance and as students gain experience, confidence and success, more independence can be afforded to students.
- Recognizing that high school students often require online learning for increased flexibility in their schedule due to high level activities, work, outside commitments.
- The online program in middle school will help students gain the online learning skills they require to facilitate a more Asynchronous learning environment.



Structure



- Class work is rolled out on a week-by-week basis (Week-at-a-Glance), with due dates for assignments on Fridays.
- In addition to instruction, teachers will have designated office hours, which is a time students can connect with them via email, video chat or phone call in real time and receive a prompt response.
- School hours are from 9:00 a.m. 3:30 p.m. school days, and will follow the traditional RDCRS calendar.
- Students can schedule in-person meetings with their teachers at St. Benedict
- Students are required to have their own device, we recommend a Chromebook, laptop, or desktop computer. Tablets and ipads are not recommended.
- Students will take a full course load consisting of Math, English Language Arts, Social Studies, Science, Religion, Health, Physical Education, and CTS courses.



Learning Platform: Schoology



- Schoology is our new Learning Management System and it will be the platform for online learning.
- Schoology will be how students access their courses, complete assignments and assessments, communicate with their teachers and engage in class discussions.
- Schoology offers students many opportunities to demonstrate their learning, through voice recordings, videos, and more.
- Schoology also integrates with PowerSchool, and all other online tools we use in RDCRS.



Characteristics of a successful Online Learner



- Organized
- Independent and Self Directed
- Self Advocacy Students can and will need to ask for help when necessary.
- Having a dedicated work space within the home.
- Having access to required learning materials:
 - -Functional computer, Desk, School supplies
- Having the discipline to follow a daily routine:
 - -For example Breakfast, School work, Exercise, Lunch, School work etc.



Assessment / Reporting



The primary purpose for assessment is to:

- Communicate learning progress to students and parents.
- Identify which students did or did not master specific essential standards and subsequently develop strategies to help students improve their mastery of the learning outcomes.
- Identify the instructional practices that did or did not improve learning
- Determine how students will use results to understand their progress toward meeting essential standards.
- Parents and students will be able to view the Gradebook in Schoology



Staffing / Student Support



 Our staffing allocation is dependent upon the number of students who enrol in the program. As an example, proposed staffing allocation based on 20 students in each grade level might look like:

Teacher 1 - Grade 6-7 Math/Science

Teacher 2 - Grade 8-9 Math/Science

Teacher 3 - Grade 6-7 Language Arts and Social Studies

Teacher 4 - Grade 8-9 Language Arts and Social Studies

Blended Programming



- Blended programming is a program offering that we as a school community are willing to explore offering to students who may require it. An example of a student who might be a candidate for blended programming would be an elite athlete who is required to attend training sessions during the school day, and for that reason is unable to attend all of their classes within an in-person environment.
- These learning scenarios will be coordinated with families on a case by case basis through school administration and the director of alternative programming. These scenarios will potentially be offered on a case by case basis where/if applicable.

Registration vs Transition



- Unlike with our school division's online learning program the last two years, this program is a school of choice program, which means:
 - It is funded as a division program.
 - Will not allow students to transition into and out of the program during the school year. Once students are registered in the program, they remain for the duration of the school year.
 - Registration for the program occurs in the fall, just like all schools within RDCRS.
